### Notice of Submission of the Mid Sussex District Plan and availability of submitted documentation

Mid Sussex District Council has prepared a District Plan which it has submitted to the Secretary of State for independent examination. The District Plan sets the strategic framework for development in Mid Sussex up to 2039, setting out the vision and objectives with an overall strategy to implement those.

The District Plan will now be subjected to an independent examination to be conducted by the Planning Inspectorate. This is a continuous process running from the date of submission through to the receipt of the appointed Planning Inspector's Report. Part of this process will involve hearing sessions where those invited by the Planning Inspector to attend will have the opportunity to respond to matters raised by the appointed Planning Inspector. These hearing sessions are likely to take place in the Autumn 2024. Once confirmed, all details relating to the examination process will be advertised, made available online and sent to those people who asked to be notified of the examination.
