#### Explanation of how the cooperation has influenced plan making

Development of Transport modelling, to ensure transport impacts on highway network can be mitigated. Following WSCC Regulation 19 reps and suggested main modifications relating to the Monitor and Manage approach. To address the representations, the Council is proposing a number of Main Modifications to the Plan (references M52, M53, M54 and M128 and also updates to the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP). In addition, a shift from using TEMPro 8 High in Scenario 5 to using TEMPro Core in Scenario 6 was made to ensure the severe impacts were not a result of overestimated growth and understated home working assumptions - TEMPro Core represents a more realistic level of growth than TEMPro 8 High.

### **Evidence of cooperation post Submission (9th July 2024 onwards)**

This has been included for completeness, noting that transport work has been ongoing since Submission. Despite the Council's view that sufficient transport work had been undertaken to inform Regulation 19 consultation and submission.
